

Organizational chart for a city government hierarchically expanded from the top down. At the very top of the chart sits the mayor, who is in the leader of each department wherein. The mayor directly oversees the roles situated amongst the next level down. These four roles are city clerk, City Treasurer, City Manager, and City Attorney. The City Clerk, City Treasurer, and City Attorney do not oversee any other roles on this chart.

The next level of the chart are roles directly overseen by the City Manager. These roles are Deputy City Manager of administrative roles, Deputy City Manager of community roles, and Deputy City Manager of public works.

The Deputy City Manager of administrative roles oversees the Chief Financial Officer, the Human resources director, and the labor relations director of the city. The organization chart indicates that the Chief Financial Officer and Human Resources Director are above the Labor Relations Director hierarchically. Again, all three of these roles are managed by the Deputy City Manager of administrative roles.

The Deputy City Manager of community roles oversees 5 roles: The Parks and Recreation Director, Police Chief, Neighborhood Director, Convention and Cultural Services Director, and Fire Chief. The Parks and Recreation Director, Police Chief, Neighborhood Director are all higher in hierarchy than the Neighborhood Director, Convention and Cultural Services Director roles, which are the next level down.

Finally, The Deputy City Manager of Public Works oversees three roles: Utilities Director, Planning and Building Director, and Economic Development Director. Utilities Director and Planning and Building Director are both higher in hierarchy than Economic Development Director
